ABOUT THE CLUB

HISTORY

In 2025, the Bannockburn Cricket Club celebrates 150 years since it was formed in 1875 as the Wabdallah Cricket Club. On the 23rd of January 1875, a meeting took place in Leigh Road (now Bannockburn) where the Wabdallah Cricket Club was formally established. On the 26th of January 1875, the Geelong Advertiser reported the following;

"An adjourned meeting of the cricketers was held at Leigh Road, on Saturday evening. There was a good attendance, and a large number of members were enrolled. It was decided to name the club the Wabdallah Cricket Club, and it was arranged to play the first game under the auspices of the club on Wednesday (tomorrow) afternoon. Messrs Cotton, Halpin, Kelly, Bamfield, and Moreillon were elected a committee to make all the necessary arrangements. Mr Cotton was appointed Treasurer, and Mr J. Goller hon. Secretary. The other officer bearers will be elected immediately after the first game. A hearty vote of thanks to the chairman Mr Halpin, terminated the meeting."

In the late 1800's, Wabdallah was renamed Leigh Road Cricket Club and eventually in the early 1900's, renamed the Bannockburn Cricket Club. The club has always played at its present venue, Victoria Park, Bannockburn. Matches were first played on coarse matting wickets until later years, when a malthoid surface was placed over the concrete strip. The Club began playing in the Geelong Cricket Association until it joined the Leigh Cricket Association/ Southern Leigh Cricket Association in 1922, before returning to the Geelong Cricket Association in 2007/2008 Season.

During the 1930's the mainstays of the club included Herbert Lumb, Doug Costain, Lou Pilloud, Harry Andrews, Hughie Bufton, Colin Benham (a great cricketer and a League footballer) and brothers Jim, Jack and Joe Lowndes. During the Second World War, the Club went into recess, eventually reforming at the end of the War until the early 1950's. at this point, when temporary lack of players caused it to withdraw from competition. However, due to the efforts of the older members, the club re-entered competition after two years in the wilderness (Beaurepaire 1995). In the 1960's, the club won four A Grade Premierships in the Leigh Cricket Association (LCA) and in the 1970's they won two more.

The club also won two B Grade premierships with the inception of that competition in 1975. In 1991, the club ran a competition with the Bannockburn Primary School in search of a new club mascot/logo. The outcome of the competition saw us become the 'Roosters' before another change in the season of 95/96 to what we are known as now, 'The Bulls'. In 1995/96, the club won its first A Grade LCA premiership in 18 years before winning it again in 1997/1998. 2021/2022 saw the introduction of two women's teams to the Barwon Women's competition, with the D Grade team winning a premiership in their inaugural year.

The club currently plays in the Geelong Cricket Association after the Southern Leigh Cricket Association disbanded at the end of the 2007/2008 season. The club currently has Senior Men's and Women's teams as well as junior teams across all age group's. Bannockburn Cricket Club has also been home to many junior cricketers over the journey, with many juniors becoming strong senior cricketers for the club. The clubs junior program also welcomed a girl's team in 2023/2024, ensuring the club is a place for all people, of all ages to come and play the great game of cricket.

The club has won the following premierships at Senior Men's and Women's level;

- 1 x Men's C Grade/3rd XI Premiership (2021/22)
- 1 x Men's D Grade/4th XI Premiership (2011/12)
- 1 x Men's GCA Twenty/20 3rd Division Premiership (2018/19)
- 1 x Women's BWCC D Grade Premiership (2021/22)


REGISTRATION

CODE OF CONDUCT



The image and reputation of the Bannockburn Cricket Club is vital to its ongoing success and reflects the Club's standing in the community. Our "Player Code of Conduct" sets the standard of conduct required of our club's members and officials as representatives of the Bannockburn Cricket Club.

Club members and officials are expected to abide by our Player Code of Conduct. As a member or official of the Bannockburn Cricket Club your conduct while representing the club in any capacity must meet the standards set out below.

These standards are guidelines only and the Committee of Bannockburn Cricket Club reserves the right to charge a member or official for conduct they believe is outside the spirit of these guidelines - whether it is explicitly covered in the Member/Player Codes of Conduct or not.

- 1. Play by the rules and abide by the Spirit of Cricket.
- 2. Never argue with an umpire. If you disagree, have your captain or coach approach the umpire during a break or after the game.
- 3. Control your temper. Verbal abuse of officials and sledging other players, deliberately distracting or provoking an opponent are not acceptable or permitted behaviors in cricket.
- 4. Work equally hard for yourself and your teammates.
- 5. Be a good sport. Applaud all good play.
- 6. Treat all participants in cricket as you would like to be treated yourself.
- 7. Co-operate with your coach, teammates and opponents.
- 8. Respect the rights, dignity and worth of fellow players, coaches, officials and spectators.
- 9. Refrain from conduct that could be regarded as sexual, racial, sexist or discriminatory.
- 10. Care and respect the Club uniform and equipment.
- 11. Be frank and honest with your coach concerning illness and injury and your ability to train and play.
- 12. Conduct yourself in a responsible manner relating to language, temper and punctuality.
- 13. No player or official shall bully any other person.
- 14. Be honest in your attitude and preparation to training.
- 15. Maintain a high standard of personal behavior at all times.
- 16. Do not engage in practices that affect sporting performance.
- 17. No member while representing the club as a player or official shall drink alcohol prior to or during the course of a match.
- 18. No member shall use social media to denigrate, humiliate or abuse other club members on open forums.
- 19. No player shall be under the influence, be in possession of or arrange possession of illegal drugs whilst on club premises.

PLAYER INUSURANCE - INJURY



As a player at the Bannockburn Cricket Club, it is important to know what you are covered for, when it comes to injury, under your club registration. The Bannockburn Cricket Club is insured, in line with all clubs in the GCA, under the **Australian Cricket National Club Risk Protection Program.**

Player protection under this program should not be considered a replacement for private health cover and players have a duty of care to themselves to ensure you have the right health cover for your personal circumstances.

What is covered:

- Non-Medicare medical costs Commonwealth Legislation prevent reimbursement of Medicare costs including the gap
- · Loss of income
- · Death & other capital benefits

How much can I claim:

Non-Medicare Medical Costs

85% reimbursement \$5,000 maximum per claim \$50 excess per claim

Loss of Income

85% reimbursement \$500 maximum per week 14 day elimination period

Important Information:

- All injuries need to be reported to your captain/coach as soon as possible who will notify the club Health and Wellbeing officer.
- The Club will support any member in a claim where it meets the criteria.
- The forms to complete will be sent to you by the Health and Wellbeing officer.
- You cannot claim for any services where you received a rebate from Medicare.
- We recommend you retain a copy for all receipts and your claim for your records.
- The insurer recommends you claim through your private health fund first, where possible.

HEALTH AND WELLBEING

Bannockburn Cricket Club is committed to playing an active role in promoting positive mental health and wellbeing to all players, volunteers, stakeholders, as well as the greater community. We recognise that sport plays an important role in our communities by bringing people together with shared goals and a sense of purpose.

We recognise that there are circumstances where external factors may affect the mental clarity a players experiences when they are at our Club. We have committed to continue to implement strategies and explore all avenues to ensure all players feel a level of safety and that all feel support when they are with us.

This season we have appointed a Health and Wellbeing Officer to ensure that our club has a direct point of contact available for confidential discussions and advice. Our Health and Safety Officer will direct the member to the appropriate resources with the aim to make them feel safe and supported whilst at the Club.

CHILD SAFETY STANDARDS



The Eleven legislated Victorian Child Safe Standards (from 1 July 2022):

- 1) **Establish** a culturally safe environment in which the diverse and unique identities and experience of Aboriginal Children and Young People are respected and valued
- 2) Embed Child Safety and Wellbeing in organisational leadership, governance and culture
- 3) **Empower** Children and Young People so that they know their rights, participate in decisions affecting them and are taken seriously
- 4) Inform and engage families in respect to child safety and wellbeing
- 5) **Ensure** that equity & diversity is upheld through our policies and practices
- 6) Engage volunteers and officials to ensure that they are suitable to work with Children and Young People
- 7) Handle complaints and concerns promptly, thoroughly and with a child focused approach
- 8) **Educate** volunteers, staff (if applicable) and officials in consultation with Cricket Victoria and Cricket Australia to provide them with the knowledge and skills to keep Children and Young People safe
- 9) Promote the safety & wellbeing of Children and Young People through physical and online environments
- 10) **Review** and improve our child safe policies, procedures and practices regularly
- 11) **Role model** behaviour and actions documented in policies, procedures and practices guiding how our organisation is safe for Children and Young People

Our Commitment to fostering the Right Culture, Environment and Child Safety

All participants in cricket, regardless of age, gender, race, sexual orientation, disability, have the right to enjoy the game in an environment that is safe from abuse of any kind. The Club recognises that safeguarding starts with setting high standards and promoting a positive culture which provides the best environment for participants to enjoy themselves and the game of cricket.

We are committed to ensuring that all individuals volunteering at or for the Club are provided with the necessary support through education, training and continued development. We ensure that all individuals volunteering at or for the Club are recruited and appointed in accordance with the relevant legislation and are committed to providing a welcoming, safe, and fun experience for children.

We promote a listening culture where the views of children, parents/carers, volunteers and other club members are proactively sought and acted upon. This helps us to create an environment where people have the opportunity and confidence to raise concerns, including concerns about poor practice, abuse and neglect.

We seek to create a partnership with parents/carers so that they know what to expect from us and what we expect of them.

It is our aim that everyone at the Club should feel confident to raise a concern, no matter how small. We believe that raising and dealing with concerns quickly, when they occur, supports a proactive safeguarding culture at the Club.

We ensure that confidential information relating to safeguarding matters is shared appropriately and only with those who need to know. The Club recognises that it is not the responsibility to investigate matters, but to act upon and report any concerns promptly.

We fully endorse the new Victorian Cricket Integrity Policies and are committed to best practices in Child Safety and Member Protection at our Cricket Club.

Incelment Weather - Extreme Heat/Rain

Junior Boys/Mixed - GJCA Competition (Friday/Saturday)

The GJCA will post updates on their facebook page an hour before the game start time to inform of any cancellation or report to grounds instructions.

If no update is provided on the GJCA facebook page or you have not received an update from your coach, please report to grounds.

Junior Girls - GGCL Competition (Sundays)

Games will go ahead as scheduled unless the temperature is scheduled to be 35 degrees Celsius or above at 10am or 11am on match days or rain is consistent in the morning of play.

Should a match be abandoned or called off due to weather with notice, the team coach will inform all players early morning prior to the game in your team chat group. Coaches will endeavour to give families as much notice as they feasibly can but sometimes this is out of our control and a decision can't be made until the time of the game. Report to grounds if no update has been provided regardless of the weather.





Team Selection

In selecting teams for each season we will consider the following:


- The friendship groups and networks of players, realising that players want to play with their friends and that this is critical part to player's enjoyment of their cricket. Please note that this is not always possible due to a range of reasons;
- The development of a child as a cricketer and as a person, ensuring players are not in a grade above their skill level that can impact their enjoyment and skill development;
- The balance of the sides for their respective grades, trying to ensure that all teams are competitive;
- The availability of parents to undertake Coaching and other tasks associated with running a team.

Junior Fixtures

All fixtures and game results will be posted and available for viewing on the PlayHQ & Play Cricket Apps.

The club will be notified of fixturing closer to the commencement of the season. However, these fixtures will be subject to change at the beginning of the competition as grading games take place.

It is important to note the club has no control over when fixtures or scheduled games are made available on play cricket. In the event a game is yet to be fixtured or not visible on the play cricket app, there is no confirmed as yet by the league.



BLASTERS



The Woolworths Cricket Blasters program is Australia's entry level cricket participation program that has been the first step on the cricket pathway for hundreds of thousands of Australian girls and boys over the past 20 years.

The Blasters program teaches girls and boys the skills to play Australia's favourite sport, through fun game based activities.

This program is aimed at kids (aged 4 to 10) with the objective is to introduce children to the game of cricket. They will be taught the basic skills of the game using structured activities with an emphasis on having fun. The program covers a range of fundamental childhood development motor skills including hitting a ball, catching, throwing, running, stopping, balance and co-ordination. We cater for different levels of individual skill and age.

To ensure the safety of all participants, we use plastic bats and a rubber ball. Activities use softer balls of different sizes, so kids can participate and develop at their own pace.

The Woolworths Cricket Blast program has been designed to engage and empower kids up to 10 years old of all skill levels and abilities, unleashing their potential through fun, game-based activities. Kids (and parents) will gain the necessary skills and knowledge to progress through the program to junior cricket and beyond! O


